Weaknesses Sheet 1

- General untidiness, maintenance of the village, scruffy
- Broadband rubbish
- What is done is done
- Rubbish in Rec and on High Street
- Beware management speak, keep it simple
- Broadband very poor
- Housing demand, very high supply very low demand
- Traffic, danger of increased parking on the street, large houses, lack of footpaths

- Traffic speed and volume along main road needs safe crossings and pavements
- Poor footpath links
- Broadband speed poor

- What is happening to the farm opposite the Wellesley?
- First homes for sale there are none at the moment
- Not enough safe cycle routes
- High Street and Chestnut Road Traffic speed

Weaknesses Sheet 3

- Divert large vehicles away from Sutton Benger
- Flooding on Seagry Road
- Drains over worked by heavy rain
- Traffic calming, adequate crossing, 30 mph further back and warning
- Poor/lack of footpaths
- No small houses apartments flats for over 55 to downsize
- Older people have to move out of village if they want to downsize
- Would like a local convenience store to be able to buy a pint of milk, loaf of bread bottle of wine without getting in the car
- Make footpath from corner of Chestnut Road to houses on right, we have to cross the road to get to Gate Farm
- · Lack of shops
- Verges full of weeds especially down bottom of Cowley Way
- Litter
- Children who grew up here cannot afford to buy houses here

Weaknesses Sheet 4
